### **ABOUT THE STUDY**

HBSC is a study that looks at the health and health-related behaviour of school-aged children across Europe and North America. The study is run by a network of researchers in close partnership with the World Health Organization. Every 4 years, the researchers visit schools with a specially created questionnaire and collect data that helps us understand child health in the broader context of how and where young people live their lives. ### WHO CAN TAKE PART?

The competition is open to anyone aged between 10 and 16 at the time of submission. All entrants must have the permission of their parents or legal guardians to participate in the competition.

Only one entry should be submitted per person. Multiple entries from one person will result in disqualification.

Entries can be created by hand or digitally. Artwork should be approximately 210 x 210mm, black and white line drawings without heavy shading, and clear and simple, without very fine lines and detailed elements.
